From Father Crookston . . .

Blessing for Father's Day God our Father, in your wisdom and love you made all things. Bless our fathers that you may strengthen them as Christian fathers. Let the example of their faith and love shine forth. Grant that their sons and daughters may honor them always with a spirit of profound respect.

The Body and Blood of Christ Today, we celebrate the solemn feast of Corpus Christi. This Solemnity is three feasts in one: the feast of the Eucharistic sacrifice, the feast of the Sacrament of the Eucharist and the feast of the Real Presence of Jesus in this Sacrament. Corpus Christi is a doctrinal feast established for three purposes: 1) to give God collective thanks for Christ's abiding presence with us in the Eucharist and to honor Him there; 2) to instruct the people in the Mystery, Faith and devotion surrounding the Eucharist, and 3) to teach us to appreciate and make use of the great gift of the Holy Eucharist, both as a Sacrament and as a sacrifice.

2017 Catholic Ministries Drive is off to a great, generous start. Our fifth report shows that one hundred thirty households have advanced \$30,670 to reach our Cathedral target. We are quickly at 85% mark!

Your Catholic Ministries gift supports our Cathedral parish and diocesan ministries. We have seen that a friendly reminder makes the difference. Over the next months, we will be doing some reminding using the bulletin, a home mailing, and a single friendly phone call. The home mailing is set for Father's Day week. The captains will make their friendly phone reminders in early July. They will contact those who have yet to give to this year's Catholic Ministries Drive, especially parishioners who have given in the past.

With everyone's help, we will exceed our diocesan assigned goal of \$36,109. Please consider a gift that reflects your gratitude for the many blessings that God has entrusted to you. If you cannot make a financial offering, please pray for the success of 2017 Catholic Ministries Drive and return your pledge card showing that you cannot give now; we will see that you do not receive a mailing request or one of our friendly phone reminders.

And You Cared for Me Our annual Mass for the Anointing of the Sick, Sunday, July 9, 1:30 P.M., is a special gathering of many members of our Saint John Gualbert Cathedral faith community. We will visit with the Lord and each other. This special liturgy will be especially joyous as we offer praise and thanks and receive God's healing. Our gathering in assembly reassures us that Christ's comfort and care come to dwell among us to heal us and give us strength. We will celebrate the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick within Mass that satisfies the Sunday obligation.

Beyond and extending this special visit with God and neighbors at church is the Communion calls that priests and Eucharistic ministers do each month with the homebound. Bearing Christ in the Eucharist and our faith community's love, these visitors carry and meet Christ in neighbors' homes and specialized care homes. These smaller gatherings of two and three with the Lord also bring solace and strength. Contact Father Jim should you want to become a Eucharistic visitor to the homebound.

May God bless all who will participate in the preparing for our celebration of our parish's special visit with Christ. May our Lord bless those who visit with neighbors and celebrate the Lord's dwelling ever so close with those who are shut-in. Finally, may God's comforting Spirit give courage and healing to all who share in Christ's cross.

John 6:51-58 – Parenting is a Eucharistic activity because from the first moment of conception children consume us, our flesh, blood, energy, time and resources. If we don't sacrifice ourselves, our children would not have life. This is the priesthood of parenting. Christ is present in this self-sacrifice. Fathering is an awesome responsibility and not for the weak or transient.

Liturgical Reflection... The *Order of Celebrating Matrimony* offers three distinct rituals for celebrating the Sacrament of Matrimony. First, there is the order of celebrating Matrimony with the Mass; secondly, there is the order of celebrating Marriage without Mass; and the Church present a ritual for celebrating Matrimony between a Catholic and a Catechumen on Non-Christian. All three orders contain the following: scripture and homily, questions addressed to the bride and groom, consent, blessing of the rings, Universal Prayer, Our Father, and Nuptial Blessing. Of course, it is the usual custom to have two Catholics married within Mass. *Order of Celebrating Matrimony*, Chapters I, II, and III, 2016.
