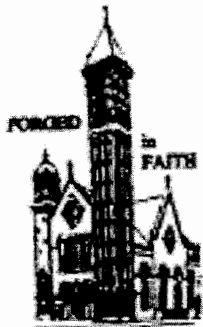

From Our Pastor . . .

Mission Co-op: Hands Together This weekend our parish participates in the diocesan Mission Cooperative Plan and we welcome **Charles Carr** who works with the missions in Haiti. The Missionary Cooperative plan assigns a mission group to every parish to speak about the work of our church in other parts of the world and to remind us that our church is fundamentally a Mission Church. Our diocesan mission office assigned Hands Together - a Catholic mission outreach working in Haiti - to share with us news of how our church continues to help the poorest of the poor.

The Church in Haiti is struggling to bring God's love to the many hurting people and we are the comfort. In Haiti there are 10.9 million people in an area smaller than Maryland. Seventy percent of these cannot read, and eighty-five percent live below poverty level. In slum areas four out of five children do not reach the age of five, and nationally one in three children suffer from chronic malnutrition. The hurricanes in 2004 and 2008, along with the devastating January 12, 2010 earthquake and hurricane later that same year, have left Haiti severely damaged and in desperate need of our prayers and support.

Hands Together runs free schools, medical clinics and nutrition programs in Cite Soleil, providing 25,000 daily school meals and helping thousands of people who struggle to survive. Their work among the violence and savage poverty there is founded upon the Catholic social teachings of the dignity of human life and a preferential option for the poor. Hands Together embraces a clear ethic of life based on Catholic teaching that proclaims God's infinite and absolute love for us. About one-third of Hands Together's mission work supports educational, health, charity, and developmental projects in City Soleil, The Dioceses of Gonaives and Cap Haitien where more than one million live in abject poverty.

Charles is a faithful volunteer for Hands Together, who has been to Haiti many times and visits parishes around the U.S. to share his experiences working with the Catholic missionaries there. Today's second collection will support Hands Together. The bulletin envelop is for your return next weekend should you want to make a gift but could not today.

FORGED IN FAITH: THE HISTORY OF SAINT JOHN GUALBERT CATHEDRAL

Chapter Twenty-Five: Father Guido Sarducci "In May 1993 a message arrived from Bishop Joseph Adamec stating that on June 9, Monsignor Saylor and the other three parish priests, Father Mark Begly, Father J. D. Zatalava, and Father Vincent Negherbon, T.O.R., would all be transferred. The congregation was shocked. Apprehension ran high. A farewell party was planned, but how does one plan a festive affair when the occasion is so sad? How does one offer good wishes and refrain from tears? With careful planning and the remarkable wit of three former parochial vicars it was all accomplished in less than two weeks. Father Neil Dadey, Father David Peles, and Father Bill Giltinan all lent their expertise to stage a program that would leave no room for tears but would keep everyone laughing.

"Father Bill Giltinan, however, was the star. With a bright red cape, a round black Italian seminarian hat, a cigarette holder, and a fitting Italian accent, his impersonation of Father Guido Sarducci of Johnny Carson fame could not be surpassed. The priests were all roasted; the hall roared with laughter; and Father Bill could have become a contender for an Academy Award. So we bade farewell to four good friends and made ready to welcome three others. Who were these three new priests, and what would they be like? Monsignor George B. Flinn and Father Albert Bechtold arrived the second week of June, and on Thursday, July 1st, they were joined by Father John Francis Brezovec. In a very short time they all found a place within our hearts, and all the apprehension was dispelled."
