From Our Pastor . . .

In Honor of Fatherhood (Found in *Celebrate Father, Prayers and Reflections on Fatherhood, Liguori Publications*). "When I was young, I bought my father a cheap plastic statue of a fisherman with an oversized, cartoon-like head. The statue read, "World's Greatest Dad." It was, in my ten-year-old mind, the highest award that could be conferred on a man. I wanted to give my father something more than a bottle of cologne or another necktie. I wanted to give him an honor. I wanted to tell him how I felt without actually telling him how I felt. . . because we did not do that much in my family.

"Now a father myself, I realize the honor of being a father is (as the cliché puts it) "all mine." To be a father -- to watch my son grow into a husband and father and my daughter into a wife and mother -- is an honor beyond any other recognition I might receive in my professional or personal life. God knew what he was doing when he allowed men to become fathers. He was giving us a glimpse of his own glory."

And You Cared for Me Our Mass of Anointing of the Sick, Sunday, July 15, 1:30 PM, is a special gathering of many members of our Saint John Gualbert Cathedral faith community. We will visit with the Lord and each other. This special liturgy is especially joyous for many worshipers.
