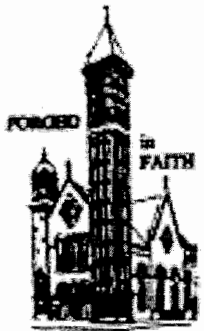

We will visit with the Lord and each other. This special liturgy is especially joyous for many worshipers. Due to the efforts of the many helpers and the liturgy preparers, homebound persons will again gather with neighbors. As a family in the Lord, we will offer praise and thanks and receive God's healing. Our gathering in assembly reassures us that Christ's comfort and care come to dwell among us to heal us and give us strength. We will celebrate the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick during this Mass. The Mass will satisfy the Sunday obligation.

Beyond and extending this special visit with God and neighbor at church is the visiting that priests and Eucharistic ministers do with the homebound. Bearing Christ in the Eucharist and our faith community's love, these visitors carry and meet Christ in neighbors' homes and in specialized care homes.
