Saint Anne Triduum Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday evenings (July 24-26), we gather at 7:00 pm for our Saint Anne Three Days of Prayer and Mass. Beyond the spiritual benefits of membership in the Saint Anne Society, we make an annual gift of \$5,000 for the education of our diocesan seminarians.

Parish Picnic: Come One Come All! Mark your calendars. Our annual parish family picnic takes place Sunday, August 19 at the Saint John Activity Center. Folk may gather following the Proclaim! TV Mass for the early afternoon lunch. The menu includes hamburgers, hotdogs, all the fixings, potato salad, baked beans, corn on the cob, cake. You may bring a dessert to share. We will serve the second meal near 4:00 P.M. with the same delicious menu. Interested in Becoming Catholic? Late August marks the first part of the process of becoming Catholic. A first meeting will occur Sunday, August 26 at 9:30 AM in the St John Activity Center located at the corner of Railroad and Adams Streets.

We will begin the period known as Inquiry. This beginning period of the Christian Initiation process helps people feel at ease with the Holy Spirit's attracting them to our faith community. During this time of searching into God's prompting, asking questions, and the inquirers' touching the inner movement of faith, seekers hear and reflect upon the stories of our Catholic community. The inquiry team members also share the faith they have found in Christ, the scriptures, Catholic belief, parish ministry and their life experiences. We welcome interested, 'looking-into-becoming-Catholic' adults, youth and children to these sessions. We will have a separate group for adults and a separate group for children and youth. Participants in the younger group are children within families considering becoming Catholic and baptized Catholic children who are past second grade and have yet to celebrate First Penance and First Communion.

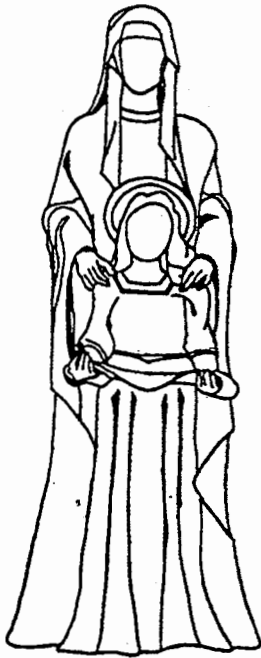
