First Communion At the 11:00 Mass this weekend, Claire O'Connor devoutly receives the Body and Blood of Christ. Jesus Christ truly present among us blesses Claire and her family.

Saint Croix, We Return! Thanks to your generous support Monica Kendera, Dave Harteis, Fr. Jim and first-time mission-travelers Joel Martin and Geoff Stumpo journey Monday (April 29) to our Sister Parish in Santa Cruz, Jamaica. While on the island, they will renew our parish's faith friendships with Father Thomas Ngigi and Sisters Hellen, Rose Cathrine, Juliet, and Agnes along with the faith community of Saint Croix parish. Father Thomas has invited the team's guys to make the parish rectory their home, while the Sisters host Monica.

Our Saint John Gualbert team will meet our sister parish's parishioners and those to whom they minister. During the week they will participate in faith sharing, visit the homebound, lend a "sprucing up" hand where it is needed at the medical clinic and church buildings, and paint the convent. On Sunday, May 5, at Santa Cruz, travelers and hosts will celebrate Harvest Mass and an all-day festival on the ground of the main church of Saint Croix.

In preparation for Harvest parishioners will gather bananas, coconuts, plantain, "ground provisions" -- the traditional root vegetable staples such as yams, sweet potatoes, dasheen root (taro), and cassava -- and a pig for the Harvest meal. Mannish water (goat soup), "*buljol*" (salted cod, sautéed with onions and tomatoes) and jerk chicken are also on the parish's harvest menu. May 6 is the return home date.
