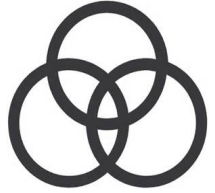

From Our Pastor...

Blessing for Father's Day God our Father, in your wisdom and love you made all things. Bless our fathers that you may strengthen them as Christian fathers. Let the example of their faith and love shine forth. Grant that their sons and daughters may honor them always with a spirit of profound respect.

Trinity Sunday In celebrating the Trinity at our liturgy today, we celebrate the greatest mystery of our faith. When Jesus speaks of the Father and the Spirit, it is in relation to himself and his connection to the relationship between the Father and the Spirit: "Everything that the Father has is mine; for this reason I told you that he will take from what is mine and declare it to you" (John 16:15). Three Persons, one God. Distinct identities, yet a communication so complete the "lines" often seem blurred.

In Jesus' public life, we see the centrality of his relationship with the other Divine Persons. The Father spoke of him, calling him his beloved Son after Jesus rose from the waters of baptism. The Spirit led him into the desert just before he embarked on his ministry. However, Jesus did not cling proudly to his position as Second Person of the Trinity: "Who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God something to be grasped. Rather, he emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, coming in human likeness ..." (Philippians 2:6-7)

In obedience to his Father, Jesus had become fully human. With the power of the Holy Spirit, he worked to bring humanity back into relationship with God.

"But when he comes, the Spirit of truth, he will guide you to all truth" (John 16:13). The same Spirit that hovered over the waters, that stirred in Mary's womb, and that raised Jesus from the dead, is the same Spirit of truth who will guide the Church to all truth. As members of the Church, the Body of Christ on earth, we have been invited, gathered, and commissioned to carry on the creative, redemptive, and sanctifying work of the Trinity.

Empowered by the Holy Spirit, in communion with the Father through the Son, we are embraced in the interrelatedness of the Trinity. God calls us to stand in solidarity with Jesus. This solidarity is based on prayer and obedience to God's will, on embracing all people, on prophetically speaking the truth of the Church's teaching even when it is unpopular, and on sacrificing ourselves for others. In this solidarity, we can hear the cries of those who are poor, be agents of reconciliation, and bring hope to those who are hopeless.

Catholic Ministries Drive 2019 – Matching Gift Opportunity: Here is how the matching opportunity works: All renewals of a previous year gift to the annual Drive/Appeal received since May 24 are now being matched dollar for dollar. So, the renewal of your \$50 gift will gain an additional \$50 for our diocesan ministries. Better still is the double-match opportunity: all first-time gifts to the annual Drive/Appeal and all increases in gifts beyond your previous most annual donation, including gifts already made for this year, are now being matched two dollars for each dollar given. Thus, an increase of \$25 or a first-time gift of \$40 will gain an additional \$50 and \$80 respectively for the pastoral, spiritual, educational and human service programs that benefit thousands of individuals throughout the eight counties we serve.

The Catholic Ministries Drive provides significant funding for diocesan ministries focused on our being Good Shepherds: *Caring for the Poor and Strengthening Families, Nurturing Our Youth, and Forming Clergy and Laity*. These include Catholic Charities, Camp Zacchaeus, ARISE Evangelization, along with diocesan-wide support for our St John Gualbert Cathedral and the live televising of our Proclaim! TV Sunday Mass.

Currently, eighty-six households have produced \$15,815. Please look this week for our parish's letter reminder invitation for your participation in the Catholic Ministries Drive.

Several parishioners have told us that they never received the initial announcement of this year's drive from the diocese and thus had no forms on which to submit a pledge.
