Synod for the Amazon and Pope Francis The Synod of Bishops for the Amazon is a time of reflection, dialogue, and listening to the needs and sufferings of indigenous people, Pope Francis said. "The Holy Spirit is the primary actor in the synod. Please, let us not drive him from the hall."

Speaking off the cuff, the pope said he was saddened to hear a "mocking comment" from a synod participant about an indigenous man wearing a feathered headdress who presented the offertory gifts at the synod's opening Mass Oct. 6. "Tell me: What difference is there between wearing a feathered headdress and the tricorne hat worn by some officials of our dicasteries (administrative departments of the Roman Curia)?" he asked, eliciting applause from synod participants. Instead of becoming a series of reductive discussions that only undermine "the poetry" of indigenous people and their cultures, he said, the synod is a way for the church to walk with them "under the guidance of the Holy Spirit."
