## The Body and Blood of Christ

### Breaking the fast

These past months have been a long stretch, a "fast" that no one expected. Moreover, we are pretty hungry:

Hungry for human contact: to re-connect with family and friends beyond the four walls that have confined us.

Hungry for peace of mind: to satisfy our fear and anxiety, to know that our families and we are and will be safe, to getting back to "normal" — whatever "normal" will be.

Hungry for the little things that bring joy and laughter to our days: eating hot dogs at a ballpark, sitting on the beach with a great book, walking in the woods, meeting friends for drinks at a downtown café, getting a haircut or our hair done.


Hungry for a sense of purpose to our days: to go back to work doing something constructive and purposeful, to bring home a paycheck again, to be able to contribute something meaningful to our communities, to care for those who are struggling.

Some of us have experienced a hunger that will never be satisfied: losing a loved one to the virus and not being able to say goodbye.

Furthermore, some of us have been hungry for bread itself, struggling to put food on the table each evening, having to do without many of the simple, basic things we depend on.

However, what we are all starving for is something which "bread" alone cannot satisfy.

**This Sunday's Solemnity of the Body and Blood of the Lord is especially poignant this spring. We have come to realize a "hunger" in our lives that food and drink cannot come close to satisfying: a hunger to belong, a hunger to matter, a hunger to be at peace, a hunger to love and be loved. If nothing else, these weeks have given us a new appreciation and**



**understanding of the words of Jesus: that the "bread" that truly nourishes is generosity and compassion that mirrors that of God, that the "treasures" of lasting value are the good we can do for those we love, that the Spirit of God lives and moves among us in selfless generosity and sacrificial service.**

**Our Returning** This weekend, we return to public Mass with social distancing, masks, hand sanitizer, and calling ahead for one of the seating locations in the Cathedral.

We are following the same masses times as before we went to phase red in addressing the coronavirus pandemic.

Last Sunday afternoon over 100 parishioners and friends came to the distribution stations in the parking lot of our Activities Center. For those unable to participate in church for Mass, from 12:30 to 1:30 on the June Sunday afternoons, Fr. Jim and Eucharistic Ministers with help by greeters will welcome in-car communicants from Adams Street. All vehicles will enter the Holy Communion drive-through lane, occupants receive instructions, move to the in-vehicle Holy Communion station, receive the Eucharist, offer a short prayer, and exit onto Railroad Street. Walk-up communicants will proceed to the gate at the walkway to the Center on Adams Street. Area Catholics are most welcome to this or other Holy Communion distributions stations.

**We will start public weekday Masses on Monday June 15 at the regular times.** For the safety of everyone, the following are part of our return to public Masses:

Everyone older than three years must wear a mask.

We will observe social distancing.

We have marked eighty seating locations that observe safe social distancing for persons not in the same household. Spouses and families can sit in one of the eighty seating locations. Ushers will help you find a seating location.

For all weekend Masses, we require your advance call-in to let us know that you are coming to Mass. Therefore, everyone must call the rectory (536-0117) or contact Fr. Jim (934-9605 – this number accepts text and voice messages, email: frjded@stroselima.com) so that we can add you to the ushers' list for who is attending a particular Mass. Only those with a reservation will have admission for that Mass.

Your cooperation in calling ahead will allow you to know whether you have access to a Mass. When any Mass reaches safe occupancy limits, you will have first access to Mass the following Sunday. We will continue the Sunday afternoon outdoor distribution of Holy Communion for those unable to attend Sunday Mass.
