### A new growing season

A dad tells how his young daughter's birthday request helped him begin to heal from his grief.

"Daddy,' my middle daughter said, 'for my birthday I want a pretty garden again.'

"Two years ago, a tiny lump and Should I have this looked at? ended with my wife's memorial service just after Easter. With the time lost to treatment, arguments and constant worry, the garden had been abandoned. My daughter, with her April birthday, did not realize how painful the memories were. Nevertheless, I began — pulling weeds, turning soil, planting seeds as my hands bled and I wept.

"Today, a daisy bloomed, and tomatoes appeared. Though the garden is a gift for my daughter, I thank her."

**In the simple, uncomplicated hope that children possess, a daughter makes more than flowers and tomatoes grow again in her family's garden — she enables meaning and hope to bloom again in her father's**

**heart. When Jesus calls his disciples to embrace the simple faith of "little ones," he is not saying that our approach to faith should be "dumbed down" to the level of children. He is calling us, instead, to embrace a faith that is centered in the love of God: love that is not compromised by self-interest and rationalization; hope that manages to find meaning in continuing on despite the grief and fear that overwhelms us; compassion that is not measured but offered entirely and unreservedly, without limit or condition. Christ is asking us to embrace a faith that is simple, pure, and honest, neither complicated nor compromised by "adult" stuff. May the "wise and learned" among us embrace the spirit of generosity and selflessness of "little ones" that enables us to plant gardens that have too long been deserts.**

**We Are Back!** We have returned to public Mass with social distancing, masks, hand sanitizer, and calling ahead for one of the seating.

The outdoor Sunday afternoon distribution of Holy Communion also continues at the Activities Center distribution stations.

We have marked eighty seating locations that observe safe social distancing. Spouses and families can sit in one of the eighty seating locations. Ushers will help you find a seating location. All weekend Masses have ample seating locations available. So that we can add you to the ushers' list for who is attending a Mass, we ask that you call the rectory (536-0117) or contact Fr. Jim (934-9605 – his number accepts text and voice messages, email: frjded@stroselima.com).

From **12:30 to 1:00 PM** on Sunday afternoons, Fr. Jim and Eucharistic Ministers with help by greeters and ushers will welcome in-car and walk-up communicants at the activities center. All will receive a prayer page, move to a Holy Communion station, receive the Eucharist, offer a short prayer, and exit onto Railroad Street. Walk-up communicants will proceed to the gate at the walkway to the Center on Adams Street. Area Catholics are most welcome to this or other Holy Communion distributions stations.

**And You Cared for Me** Due to the coronavirus, our annual Mass for the Anointing of the Sick, is Monday, July 13, 7:00 PM. Please contact the rectory (536-0117) or Father Jim (934-9605) to reserve a seating location. Masks will be required. Should all the limited Cathedral seating locations be reserved, we will have a second Anointing of the Sick Mass the next evening at 7:00 PM.

At this unique gathering of many members of our Saint John Gualbert Cathedral faith community, we will visit with the Lord and each other. Our gathering in assembly reassures us that Christ's comfort and care come to dwell among us to heal us and give us strength.

Beyond and extending this within our Cathedral visit with God and neighbors are the Communion calls that priests and Eucharistic ministers do each month with the homebound in their homes or apartments. Bearing Christ in the Eucharist and our faith community's love, our visitors carry and meet Christ residing in neighbors' homes. These smaller gatherings of two and three with the Lord also bring encouragement, solace, and strength. Contact Father Jim (934-9605) should you want to become a Eucharistic visitor to the homebound. Currently, visits to nursing care facilities are on hold until such visits are safe to resume.

May God bless all who will participate in the preparing for our celebration of our parish's special visit with Christ. May our Lord bless those who visit with neighbors and celebrate the Lord's dwelling ever so close with those who are shut-in. Finally, may God's comforting Spirit give courage and healing to all who share in Christ's cross.
